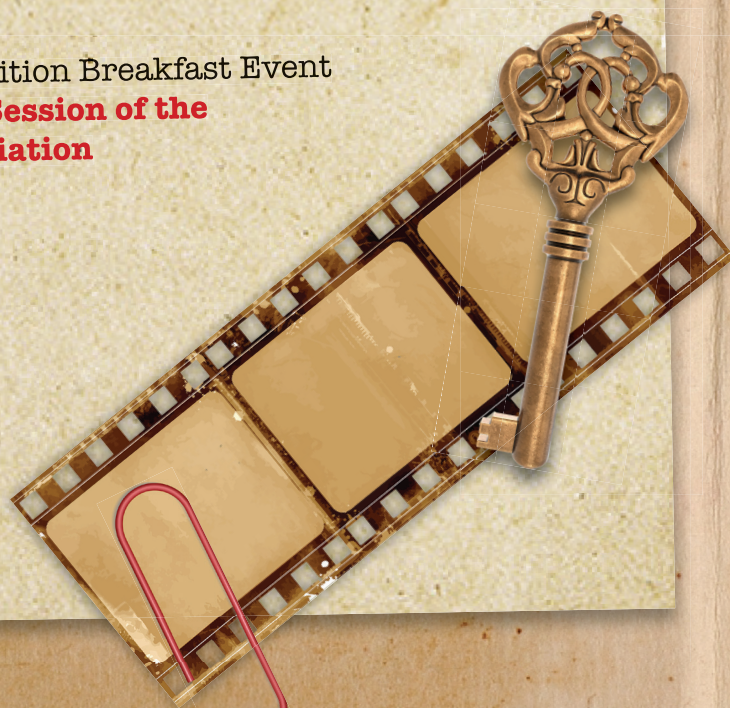

The World Health Organization began facilitating awareness and research into “social determinants of health” in the early 2000s. But what about emotional well-being? Get Clued in to Perfect Posture Mechanics

The dental profession is at high risk for musculoskeletal disorders, with up to 96% of practitioners reporting pain due to clinical work habits. This is due to repetitive movements, bending, twisting, reaching, incorrect operator and patient positioning, and performing repetitive movements in a static posture.

Ergonomics is the science of fitting the working environment to the practitioner, instead of forcing one's body to acclimate to the environment. Practicing proper ergonomics can increase productivity, decrease pain, and lengthen one's career. Allowing the individual to practice pain-free, ergonomics can increase the quality of one's life and work satisfaction.

At the conclusion of this course, participants will learn ergonomic techniques, stretches and equipment choices to allow them to practice pain-free

Computer Backup and Disaster Recovery for the Modern Dental Office

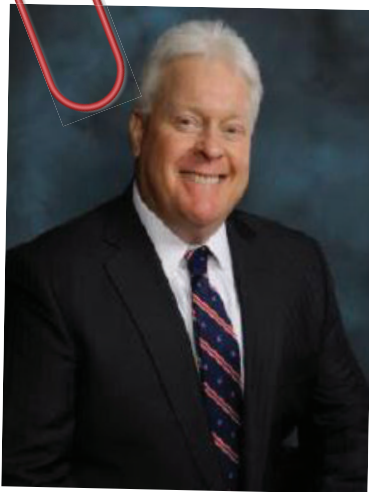
With the power of digital records comes the responsibility of maintaining backup copies of that information that can be used to recover from hardware failures, software failures, accidental (or malicious) user deletions, as well as catastrophic events (like ransomware, fire, tornado, theft, etc). Maintaining timely backups of all these different types of information in a format that allows for rapid restoration is far more difficult than it may first appear.

In our session we will cover:

- Protecting your data from “bad guys” (ransomware, malware, etc)
- Why training of your personnel is the first line of defense

Active Shooter Awareness and Preparedness and Cybersecurity

Hear the behind the scenes stories of many of the most recent mass shootings, how they happened, how they were planned, how law enforcement responded, and important clues that could potentially prevent future such tragedies. The presenter has responded to two school shootings and the shooting of Congresswoman Gabrielle Giffords. John was also present in Las Vegas when the Mandalay Bay shooting occurred, where he then served as an on-air law enforcement consultant for Fox News, CNN, NBC, and other national news programs, giving him inside access to the crime scene. This access, in addition his having responded to numerous

Why rob a bank when a criminal can steal far more while sitting in front of a computer? Beyond just money, the sensitive personal information of employees and customers is attractive to the cyber thief. Additionally, remote work technologies like Zoom and webinars have provided cybercriminals with new ways to disrupt business and steal what is yours. Every year millions become victims because they did not know how to protect themselves from cybercrime. By using examples of actual FBI cases, John reveals the ways you are vulnerable to a cyberattack, the threats inherent with remote technologies, and how you can protect yourself.

Reducing Dental Practice Risk

3 CEUs

Through an analysis of closed Fortress malpractice claims, this course will provide strategies and resources to enhance patient safety and to reduce risk in the dental practice. Closed claim topics include esthetic restorations, wisdom tooth extractions, oral cancer, endodontic treatment, and implants. Risk management topics include documentation, communication, informed consent, technology, patient selection, referrals, prescription practices, patient noncompliance, and ethics. There are no prerequisites.

Key takeaways:

1. Identify common dental malpractice risks
2. Understand how to adapt office policies and procedures to mitigate exposure to identified risks in the dental practice
3. Implement strategies with professional teams and referral networks to encourage patient safety and reduce risk
4. Understand the litigation process, board investigations and the role of the insured provider in each
